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## Great runs and no end in sight

THE NORD RUN AND THE INFINITY RUN: WINTER SPORTS (ALMOST) WITHOUT LIMITS

Skigastein is the highest skiing area in the Ski amadé region. Being so high up means you can always be sure of snow. But there's more to it.

When you're right at the top and look down at the snowy valley, you get an inkling that there are some of the longest runs round here. For instance, there's the legendary Nord Run (North Run) in Bad Hofgastein, stretching over 10 km and with 1,441 metres difference in altitude.

For a really tough challenge, you might want to try the two long valley runs from Schlossalm. One of them leads into the Angertal valley, providing a convenient link to the neighbouring Stubnerkogel. And once you're there, you can choose between two routes all the way down to the bottom. A real treat for all skiing enthusiasts, where you'll soon forget all your physical exertion as you glide down perfectly groomed slopes and take in the breathtaking views that unfold before you. In all, you can look forward to a vertical drop of over 4,000 metres – aptly named the "Skigastein Infinity Loop".




#### Thursday, 10:00 hrs: Summit View Winter Walk

#### "THE BEST WAY TO UNDERSTAND NATURE IS TO SPEND TIME IN IT"

Whether it's animals, plants, glaciers, water or rocks – as a park warden in the Hohe Tauern National Park, Hans Naglmayr has learned everything there is to know about the mountains, and he's happy to share this knowledge with our guests in Skigastein. In our new weekly programme, he leads the Ski Safaris on Mondays and the Snowshoe Walks on the Graukogel on Fridays. In this Mountain Views interview, he shares what he hopes to achieve through those activities.



#### Hans, you've been spending time with people in nature for many years. Can you tell us why?

There are so many things you can convey here that would otherwise be hard to explain. For instance, the issue of melting glaciers and why environmental protection is also about protecting humans. The best way to understand nature is to spend time in it.

#### How does that tie in with winter sports?

Gastein, in particular, has been doing a lot to make tourism more sustainable. We can offer some fantastic options – on and off the skiing guests while also channelling the flow of visitors a bit and fostering some awareness that plants, animals and humans need to be in harmony. And I wanted to do my part in this.

#### How does that look in practice, and what can our guests expect on a Ski Safari?

There's definitely a lot to talk about. For example, I can demonstrate very clearly why you should stay on marked slopes. Every time you take a shortcut, you risk scaring animals and causing them to panic, or even damaging young forests. Other intriguing topics are water reservoirs and snow cannons.

#### And what about the Snowshoe Walks?

The "Zirbenzauber" circular trail on the Graukogel is one of the most beautiful walks I know. The stone pines that line the route are magnificent trees and wonderful examples of the beauty of evolution. They are among the few species of trees that can withstand lightning strikes. Without this resilience, they wouldn't be able to thrive at such high altitudes.

### How have your guests been responding

Very positively. I've noticed that they often snow profiles and avalanche warning levels. But, of course, how could they know? And so our guests are grateful that someone is sharing this information with them. I do believe it encourages many of them to look at nature from a different perspective.

#### Do we need to be physically fit to take part

It's far more important to have the right equipment, actually. We'll provide the snowshoes, but a T-shirt and trainers are obviously inadequate for alpine terrain. As for physical fitness: if you can cope with a leisurely hiking path, you're unlikely to have any problems on my guided tours. We take our time, so everyone can make the most of the mountains and enjoy their time there.

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## The Nord Run

#### MOMENTS OF BLISS ON ONE OF THE LONGEST RUNS IN THE EASTERN ALPS

The Nord (North) Run covers over ten kilometres and has a vertical drop of 1,441 metres. However, these are just the bare facts which tell you very little about the thrill of setting off from the Hohe Scharte top station, at an altitude of 2,304 metres, with one of the longest runs of the Eastern Alps stretching out before you.

Mere figures can't do justice to the pure joy of feeling virgin snow under your skis as you descend the first steep slope. Neither do they reveal the magnificent view of the entire valley right up to the Hochkönig, which you'll enjoy after mastering this challenge. They can only give you the slightest idea of the gradual fatigue you'll feel in your thighs as you tackle this steep, larch-lined slope. They're silent about the self-discipline it takes to ignore the only refreshment stop along the way and continue gliding towards Bad Hofgastein. And they certainly don't tell you about the bliss of skiing down to the Weitmoserin Inn. In other words, the Nord Run is something you need to experience first-hand - preferably tomorrow.

It's definitely a lot more than a ski run. It's an unforgettable experience - and in fact not just for world-class skiers. If you're reasonably proficient and in good shape, then it's a great place to celebrate personal achievements, as the run offers something for everyone, from gentle slopes to steep descents. And you can look forward to two photos to remember this special day: one at the Photo Point at the starting position and one on the Leader Board at the finish.

A rare treat: for the ultimate Nord feeling, start early in the morning. At 9 o'clock in the morning, you can have the slope almost entirely to yourself and make the first tracks in the freshly

groomed snow. It's a wonderful sensation to enjoy a few snowplough turns and admire the Gastein mountains in their magnificent early

#### The Nord Race on 5 April 2025

Quite a few thrill-seekers are already counting the days until 5 April 2025. In the Nord Race, skiers will race down a Super-G on this legendary run. The fastest among them will make it down in around six minutes. Since last year, this challenge has also being offered to snow-





## The Infinity Run

#### **ENDLESS SKIING FUN BETWEEN THE** STUBNERKOGEL AND SCHLOSSALM

Not many ski resorts have their cable cars right next to a train station – ideal for visitors. In Bad Gastein, you can arrive by train and then walk straight to the valley station of the Stubnerkogel cable car.

About 10 minutes later, you'll have reached reserve of the Angertal Valley. In all, you can look forward to four long skiing runs, totalling level, where you'll also find our famous suspension bridge. It's a fantastic highlight, but if you're a skiing enthusiast, this is just the beginning of your Gastein experience. In fact, you may not even have noticed it, but you're already in the midst of the "Skigastein Infinity Loop", an absolute must for ski fans. Just as the architecture of the 360-degree Glocknerblick viewing platform on the Stubnerkogel resembles a crown, you will feel like royalty on the slopes that follow. They are suitable for both novice and expert skiers.

The Infinity Run consists of four slopes and promises endless skiing fun between the Stubnerkogel in Bad Gastein and the Schlossalm in Bad Hofgastein. You can start on either mountain and as you do so, you may want to enjoy a pleasant stopover in the beautiful nature a vertical drop of over 4,000 metres - in other words, skiing fun with (almost) no limits.

- The Number 11 Run: To get from the Stubnerkogel to the Angertal Valley, the Number 11 Run is everyone's top choice. It's one of the most beautiful runs near Salzburg, and despite its vertical drop of 1,150 metres, it also offers a fantastic experience for a more leisurely descent.
- The Junger Run: For many locals, this is undoubtedly their most favourite descent from the Junger chairlift on the north side of the Stubnerkogel - especially towards the end of the season, as its position promises an ideal piste even in spring.

The Infinity Run promises almost unlimited skiing fun – with breathtaking views of the Gastein Valley and the surrounding mountains.



And yet, quite often, you carry on anyway because you want to make the most of your day ticket. The solution is to get one of our new hourly tickets in Gastein, as it gives you perfect flexibility.


